## THE COURSE

Classes are multi-national and lead by qualified and experienced teachers. The emphasis of the course is on improving communicative skills and fluency with a strong focus on interaction. Students are expected to contribute to pair and groupwork in order to complete tasks.

We use a variety of materials to develop reading and listening skills and students revise and extend grammar and vocabulary in context. Pronunciation practice is integrated throughout and students develop writing skills through project work.

The course provides the opportunity both for international exchange and for students to learn about Scotland. We have an excellent programme of visits and social events in which students explore the city of Dundee, visit places of historical interest and natural beauty, and learn about Scottish heritage and culture.

There are classes from elementary to advanced level (depending on demand), with a minimum class size of 6 and a maximum of 15. Students are usually over 18 years of age.



### DATES

The complete course lasts four weeks from 6th July – 31st July 2009  
The minimum enrolment period is two weeks.  
You can also start on 13th, or 20th July 2009.

18 hours of classes plus 12 hours of visits per week

### ACCOMMODATION

1. Homestay with meals is accommodation in a private home where the meals are provided (breakfast and evening meal). Bedrooms are single or shared. The cost is £90 - 95 per week. Vacancies in this type of accommodation are limited.

2. Self Catering Homestay is accommodation in a private home or hostel- type accommodation, where you organise your meals yourself. Bedrooms are single or shared. The fee is £65 - 70 per week.

3. Accommodation for couples can be arranged, if booked early.

Note: For insurance and safety reasons the College cannot arrange accommodation for individual students under the age of 18.
